## Gold Award Basics

To earn your gold award you must be in 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, or 12<sup>th</sup> grade and be a registered Girl Scout Senior or Ambassador. Gold Award projects are completed individually and may not be done with a partner or as a group.

**Pre-requisites:** There are two options to complete the prerequisites for the Gold Award.

- **Option 1:** Earn the Girl Scout Silver Award and complete one Senior or Ambassador Journey (depending on your level) **and must attend a Gold Award workshop**
- OR**
- **Option 2:** Complete two Senior or Ambassador Journeys (depending on your level) **and must attend a Gold Award workshop**

### Project Proposal Deadline:

Project proposals must be submitted into Go Gold by the first Monday of that month. Once submitted and received, you will be contacted with an available time for you to meet with the committee on the following Tuesday.

(If you are a graduating senior, you must submit a proposal **and** be approved by the Gold Committee in May of your graduating year. No proposals will be accepted after that date.)

### Final Report Project Deadline:

In order to participate in the ceremony of any given year (usually occurring in April or May) the final report is due by March 1<sup>st</sup> of that year. Once, submitted and received, you will be contacted with an available time for you to meet with the committee on the following Tuesday.

(If you are a graduating senior, you must submit your final report by September 30<sup>th</sup> of your graduating year. No final projects will be accepted after that date.)

### Go Gold Online:

The online system that you will utilize in your Gold Award journey. You must log in and complete a profile within **one year** of attending a workshop.
