Dear Parent,

All Girls entering fourth grade through age 18 can enroll in any activity in this booklet listed for their age level. All participants must be registered Girl Scouts. Girls and adults may join by paying the \$12.00 national enrollment fee.

Each scoop is described in the following pages so that individual girls may choose activities they would enjoy; some will fulfill badge requirements, some are just for fun. If you would like more information please contact the coordinator listed. As these events have to be planned far in advance we may add more at a later time and get them to you.

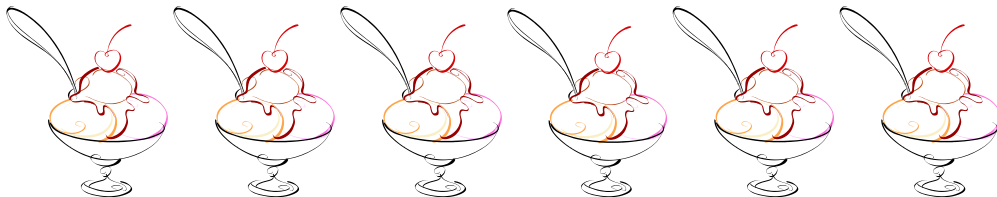
Registrations will be accepted beginning April 15 but you may register up until 2 weeks before the event. You may register for all at once or send in registrations as many times as you choose. Activities are on a first come first served basis. If friends want to attend together please send their registrations together as we cannot go over maximums. All of this will go on the council website on May 1 so you will be competing with a lot more girls for space after that. Our base cone patch costs \$2.00 and the scoops for the top costs \$3.00 please include this cost with your registration.

You will receive a refund if a session is full, a minimum number is not reached, a coordinator needs to cancel, if you cancel out of a class with two weeks or more notice allowing us to fill the spot. Refunds will be made at the coordinators discretion if notice is less than two weeks. All refunds will be minus a \$.50 fee. All refunds will be made at the end of the month. If refund is less then \$10 the refund will be made at the end of the Scoops program in August. Please contact Amelia for all cancellations or questions (285-5108 or abfirewalker@cox.net.)

Be prepared! No matter what Scoop you are doing, always dress appropriately for the weather and the activity and bring your own water bottle. You may need to bring a sack lunch or dinner as there may not be snacks provided, and hungry Girl Scouts are not happy Girl Scouts. If you have special needs please include note with your registration so that they may be accommodated.

We will hike the Watonga lake north Loop (4.9 miles). This hike begins and ends at the General Store. The hike is rated as moderate. Most reasonably fit adults and children over the age of 12 should have no problems completing the hike. The trail consists of dirt and large rocks and is mostly flat with some short climbs and descents. Each hiker **needs to bring:** A daypack with 3 liters of water, snacks, and a lunch (we'll stop and eat on the trail). Dressing in layers is recommended. Depending on the weather, a rain jacket or sun protection may be necessary. If it has been raining, the trails at Roman Nose can be really muddy, so boots would be best. An extra pair of shoes to change into for the car ride home is not a bad idea. Safety-Wise requires we have a least one other non-related registered adult to attend so let us know if you are interested. This is considered a high-risk activity.

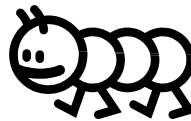
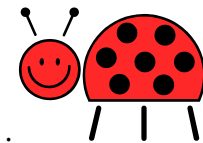
