**And complete 6** of these:

1. What is Oklahoma's nickname?
2. What is the state capital of Oklahoma? Find it on the map of Oklahoma.

4. What is the Oklahoma state bird? Can you find one out your window?
5. What is the state flower?
6. What is the state wildflower?
7. Draw a picture of the official state animal.
8. Look around your neighborhood for a Red Bud tree. Why is this tree special to Oklahoma?
9. Does Oklahoma have a state rock? What is it?
10. What is the state fruit? Do you like to eat it?
11. What is the state beverage/drink?
